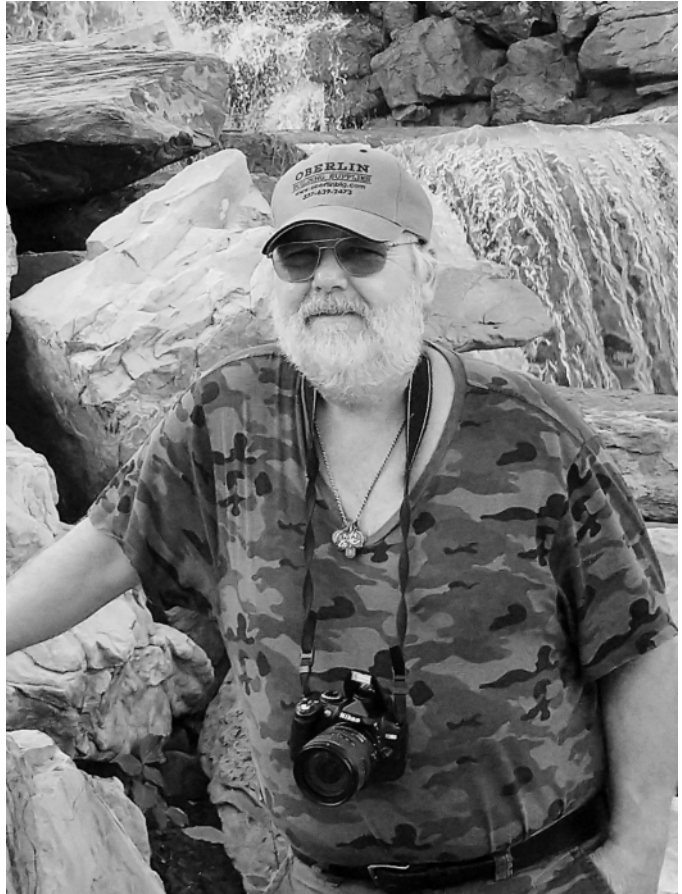

The Allen Parish Fair is a four-day Fair. The Fair will open at 6:00 pm., Wednesday, November 16, and close Saturday, November 19, 2022. All exhibitors must be from Allen Parish or attend an Allen Parish School. (The only exception is the open Cattle Show.)

THE FAIR ASSOCIATION WILL TAKE EVERY PRECAUTION TO INSURE SAFETY TO EXHIBITS BUT IN NO CASE SHALL THE ASSOCIATION. THE SECRETARY/MANAGER OR ANY OFFICER OR EMPLOYEE OF THE ALLEN PARISH FAIR ASSOCIATION BE HELD RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY LOSS, INJURY, DEATH OR DISEASE OF ANY CHARACTER TO ANY SUCH PROPERTY WHILE THE EXHIBIT IS ON THE FAIR GROUNDS

All display booths must be set up Monday, November 14th or Tuesday, November 15th, from 8:00am until 5:00pm. They must remain on Display until Monday November 21, 2022. They must be removed from 8:00am to 4:00pm. on Monday, November 21, 2022. **Any display items not picked up will be destroyed.**

(A) Entry Forms are to be completed in full with name, address, and complete school name. Incomplete forms will not be accepted. No premiums will be paid if forms are not completed with correct addresses. Forms should be brought in along with exhibit to the fairgrounds on Monday November 14th and Tuesday November 15th

between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. General Exhibits will be released on Monday, November 21, 2022 from 8:00 am. - 5:00 pm. Any articles not picked up on Monday, November 21, 2022 will become property of the Allen Parish Fair Association.

(B) Culinary Exhibits will be accepted **ONLY** Wednesday, November 16, 2022 between 7:00a.m.-8:30a.m. due to spoilage.

NO EXHIBITS WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER 8:30AM.

(C) Poultry will be accepted Tuesday, November 15th **only** from 12:00 noon until 8:00pm. Judging will be Wednesday, November 16, 2022 at 10:00am.

(E) To exhibit an item, the exhibitor must either attend an Allen Parish School or be a resident of Allen Parish. A Junior exhibitor must be a current member of 4-H, FCCLA, or FFA. If not a member of these organizations, the entries will be accepted in the Adult/Sr. Division.

Exhibits not listed in the catalog will be accepted for exhibition purposes only. A premium will not be paid.

No exhibit will be removed or claimed from the Fair Grounds without a claim check for same.

Protest against an award must be made in writing in the form of an affidavit to the Board of Directors no later than twelve (12) hours after the award was made.

Matters not covered in the regulations will be decided by the Superintendent in charge of the Department.

General Exhibit buildings will be open on Wednesday, November 16, 2022 from 4:00pm - 8:00 p.m.; Thursday, November 17, 2022 from 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 noon and 4:00pm - 8:00p.m.; Friday, November 18, 2022 from 10:00 a.m. - 9:00 p.m.; Saturday, November 19, 2022 from 11:00 a.m. - 9:00 p.m. School tours will be on Thursday November 17th, from 9:00am until Noon. Schools need to call Wednesday November 16th after 12:00 noon to arrange a tour. Call 337-853-9946.



AGRICULTURAL DEPARTMENT

RULES

1. All Agriculture exhibits competing for premiums will be placed in a parish wide commodity booth and not in any special booth such as Vocational Agricultural, 4-H, FFA, etc. The Agricultural products in the various booths such as Vocational Agricultural, 4-H, FFA, etc. will be for display only.
2. Agricultural products should be labeled as to variety on the entry tag.
3. All exhibits in the Agricultural Department must be grown, made or manufactured on the farm of the exhibitor in Allen Parish.
4. Only one exhibit of any farm variety or produce grown on the same farm will be awarded a premium unless the exhibits are from two separate fields or were produced by different members of the family.
5. All Agriculture exhibits must be entered on Monday November 14th or Tuesday November 15th between 8am and 5pm.
6. All exhibits must remain on display until 8:00 a.m., Monday, November 21, 2022. Any items not picked up on Monday, November 21, 2022 will be destroyed.

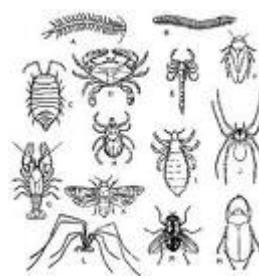
1. The exhibitor should refer to Cooperative Extension publications 2531 (7 to 9th grade) and 1645 and 1644 Unit I for rules and guidelines. In the last five pages of Cooperative Extension Publication 2531 is the list of trees which will be used. No others will be accepted. (See pages 16 - 19 of Publications 2531 for details about how to display collection.) Publication 1645 contains the rules for members who are 14 years old and older.
2. All exhibits must have been prepared since the Parish Fair of the preceding year. Old exhibits will not be accepted.
3. Leaves will be mounted on white cardboard 22 x 28 inches. Leaves only may also be exhibited in a loose leaf note book binder or similar ringed folder.
4. The title shall be Tree Leaves of Louisiana. The title shall be placed across the 28 inch side of the poster board. The title shall be one half inch from the top and shall be one inch in heights.
5. Mounting the material shall start two inches from the top and two inches from the upper edge of the poster board.
6. In the lower right hand corner the exhibitor will print his name, 4-H Club or FFA Chapter, Parish and Post Office.

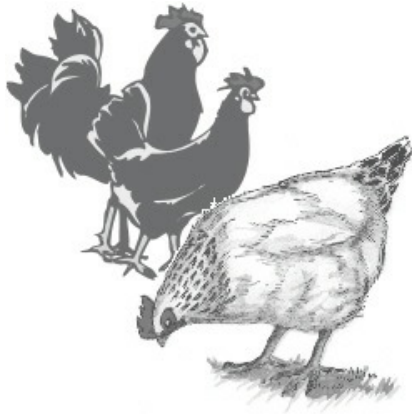
1. All insects displayed must have been collected within the past twelve (12) months.
2. Exhibits should be enclosed in a wooden case 18 inches wide by 24 inches long by 3 1/2 inches deep with a glass top.
3. Each insect, specimen shall have a collector's label showing the place collected and the name of collector. This label shall be centered on the pin 1/2 inch from the bottom of the case and read from left side of the specimen.
4. Specimen shall also be labeled as to common name (if specimen has a common name). This label shall be placed beneath the specimen flat on the bottom of the case with the pin through the center and read from the left side of the specimen.
5. Specimens shall be grouped by Orders.
6. Specimens shall be positioned in the case where they will be facing forward when the case is horizontal.
7. The name, address, parish, age, 4-H Club, or FFA Chapter of the exhibitor shall be displayed on the outside of the glass in the lower right-hand corner of the case on a 1" x 3" card.
8. Collections for boys and girls under 14 years of age shall consist of exactly 50 specimens, six of which shall be moths or butterflies which will be judged on the basis of proper mounting rather than economic importance.
9. Collections for boys and girls over 14 years of age shall consist of exactly 75 specimens; ten of which shall be moths or butterflies which will be judged on the basis of proper mounting rather than economic importance.
10. Exhibits shall be judged as follows: (Note: See Cooperative Extension publications 1611, 2609, and 1615 for details on Insect Collections.)

Proper Identification 1 point each
Orders represented 3 points each
Proper Identification as to common name 1 point each
Economic importance of specimens 2 points each
Condition of specimens 1 point each
Proper mounting 1 point each

Proper labeling 1 point each
Butterflies and Moths properly mounted 2 points each
Neatness and arrangement 20 points
Corrections in size of case 20 points

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. All specimens for exhibition for competition must be entered in the actual name of owner.
2. All poultry showing symptoms of disease will not be allowed to compete and will be removed from the grounds.
3. All birds will be judged by the comparison method, using the American Standard of Perfection as guide.
4. In addition to the first and second cash prize listed below, the Fair Association will offer as a prize the cost of feed and care of each bird and rabbit during the Fair.
5. The following definitions will apply to all exhibits in this department: Cock - Male bird, 12 months or over
 Hen - Female bird, 12 months or over ,
 Cockerel - Male Bird, under 12 months old,
 Female Bird, under 12 months old .
6. All animals and poultry must remain on display until Saturday, November 19, at 10:00 p.m., at which time they will be released. The barn will be opened until noon on Sunday, November 20, 2022 for those wishing to pick up their animals at that time.

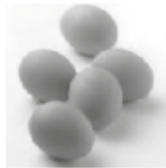

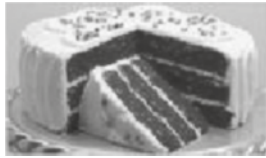

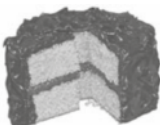
